ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Re: Amnesty Project

The 22nd Judicial Circuit will participate in the Better Family Life 2016 Metropolitan Area Amnesty Project, from August 8, 2016 through August 19, 2016. In the 22nd Judicial Circuit, this project will be applicable for **misdemeanor and child support cases only**. Individuals who receive an Amnesty Voucher from Better Family Life may have warrants for **missed court dates** on misdemeanor and child support cases quashed/recalled for a reduced bond amount under the following procedures:

1. Post a bond of \$100 for each misdemeanor warrant with the 22nd Judicial circuit Cashier's Office. Only the person charged is eligible to appear at the Cashier for the 22nd Judicial Circuit to post the bond. The Cashier's Office is located in the Civil Courts Building at 10 North Tucker Boulevard, St. Louis, MO, on the 1st floor.
2. Appearances for the purpose of cancelling any misdemeanor warrant will only be handled between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning August 8, 2016 through August 19, 2016.
3. Appearances for the purpose of cancelling any child support warrant will only be handled between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning August 8, 2016 through August 19, 2016.
4. A bond of \$100 in cash only must be paid in order to cancel a warrant on a misdemeanor case. The \$100 bond must be posted for each misdemeanor case that is in warrant status.
5. Child Support cases will be handled on a case-by-case basis. Upon appearance at the Cashier, an Assistant Circuit Attorney will be contacted. If the individual who is being charged is able to make satisfactory arrangements with the Circuit Attorney's Office, the warrant shall be cancelled.

6. In exchange for posting the bond, the individual will be given a receipt by the cashier. A receipt will be provided for each case for which bond was posted.
7. Once the bond is posted, the individual who is charged must hand-deliver his/her receipt to either Division 25 or Division 26, both located on the first floor of the Carnahan Court Building, 1114 Market Street, St. Louis, MO.
